| Submission                       | <p>In 1970, Fujita Health University (FHU), a comprehensive medical university, pioneered an interprofessional education program, the “Center for The Assembly Education”. Within this progressive, team-based learning (TBL) program, students from various departments participate in interdisciplinary teams.</p> <p>One of their success stories is a community-based integrated care system, titled the “Toyoake Model”. FHU collaborated with Toyoake City to invigorate an aging housing complex community by providing practical at-home medical/nursing/social care and rehabilitation, with students and faculty living within the complex to tackle local challenges. The</p> <p>The Ministry for Health, Labour and Welfare recognised the effectiveness of the project and commissioned FHU to train local officials who will lead community-based integrated care systems across Japan.</p> <p>FHU’s educational model is going beyond medicine, striving towards a holistic “culture” that supports the nation.</p> |
