Submission	Bucks New University, with a long history of working with Gypsy, Traveller and Roma (GTR) students, has taken action in response to growing interest amongst GTR activists in exploring barriers to access to higher education. Our Executive Team, led by Vice-Chancellor Professor Nick Braisby, is expanding existing
	work with the communities to adopt a whole institution focus on widening participation and access for members of the GTR and Showmen/Boater (GTRSB) communities.
	Our work brings together NGOs, GTRSB graduates and students, and other HEIs, to initiate a step-change in good practice and awareness of the support GTRSB students require and the challenges they experience.
	This has included creating a 'network of practice' and developing a 'good practice pledge' in the wake of a House of Lords roundtable hosted by Baroness Whitaker, Co-Chair of the All-Party Parliamentary Group for Gypsies, Travellers and Roma, alongside GTRSB graduates, HEIs, academic experts and educational NGOs.
