Submission	I founded the YEAR Centre, an outdoor experimental archaeology teaching/research space at the University of York.
	I developed undergraduate and postgraduate modules and co-designed an MSc/MA programme enabling students to engage in experiential learning: bridging theory and practice.
	Rather than simply tell students how an artefact was made and used, I encourage them to experience this themselves, often while sitting around a campfire. This informal outdoor learning environment has broken down social barriers and increased student engagement.
	The pedagogy of "green spaces", now recognised for positively promoting mental health, was the subject of an article I published in the university's teaching journal (2019). My teaching is research-led, with innovative assessment methods (writing a journal-style article; producing documentaries) empowering students to become active researchers themselves.
	Assessments have genuine value beyond the university: providing key resources for heritage stakeholders whilst strengthening student CVs in a competitive job market.
