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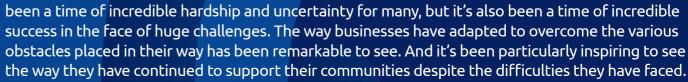

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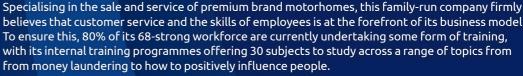

Market analysis has shown Acorn Training Ltd to be the third fastest-growing training provider in Britain. Despite the difficulties of the pandemic, Stoke-on-Trent-based Acorn Training is on track to turn over more than £2.6m this year, with a profit of £330,000 - a huge leap from the £506,418 planned loss in 2017. It has achieved this by diversifying the business, including expanding into the justice market, supporting ex-offenders back into work. New training centres are now planned for Hanley and Burton upon Trent.



Best of British Beer

Since it started trading in 2011, the Best of British Beer has been championing small independent beer and cider makers by selling their wares online. It has grown from selling directly to the customer to supplying beers and gifts to businesses such as Selfridges, Funky Pigeon and Not On The High Street. The boom in popularity of its 'The Staying Inn' home pub kits during the pandemic has contributed to it reaching more than half of 2019's turnover in just two months of 2021.



RKW Ltd

Established in 1989, RKW Ltd is one of Europe's leading manufacturers and distributors of small domestic appliance and houseware products. Over three decades it has seen a 74% growth in sales, year on year. Its flagship owned brand Tower grew by more than 100% in 2020, giving it a retail value of £132m. RKW now has offices in Hong Kong, Taiwan, India and mainland China, as well as Staffordshire, and it nurtures strong partnerships with 5,000 retailers around the globe.

It anticipates a five to eight-fold growth when it introduces its forthcoming new leisure vehicle product.



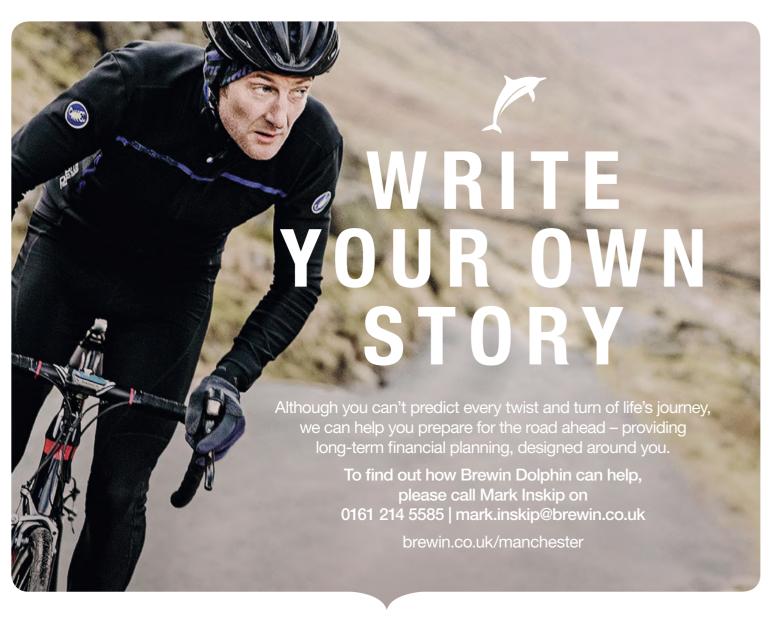
Haughton Design Ltd

Former Madeley High School pupil Eben Lovatt founded car lease comparison site Moneyshake. com in 2019. The website matches those looking for a car with the best car lease deals and personal contract purchase offers on the market. Since its inception it has generated £8m in written vehicle contracts and has leased more than 1,000 vehicles after establishing successful commercial tie ups with big partners such as Moneysupermarket and Clearscore. In December 2020, Eben successfully secured £1m of new investment to help take the business forward.



Jason Harker | Planterra Business Centre

Jason Harker has grown the Planterra Business Centre exponentially in the last 10 years. Under his leadership and vision, the group of predominantly horticultural and arboricultural businesses have grown some 528 per cent - turning over more than £1m in 2020. Planterra now has 31 employees, and Jason's vision is to grow it to a £10m group of market leading companies. Over the next 12 months, he will be working towards a turnover of £1.9m - a 70 percent growth on the previous year.



Adam Whitehouse | TMT First

Adam Whitehouse founded TMT first in 2006 to develop software that would customise mobile devices for industry-leading brands and retailers. Since then, he has grown the business to 110 members of staff, creating his own training academy that gives local people the chance to start new careers as technical repair professionals. In the last 12 months, Adam's firm has doubled its workforce, increased turnover and doubled its profits. Turnover in 2019/20 was £9.8m and plans are to increase that to £19m this year.

Twenty seven years after DWP was set up as a sole trader, the haulage company now employs 40 dedicated team members, operating 30 trucks that travel the UK and Europe carrying food produce of every kind. While Covid-19 shook the industry, D.W.Ps faith in its staff and their capabilities led them to invest more than £2m into the business. It has seen a turnover boost and profit growth of 35%, and it attributes its success to its team which is led by third generation haulage contractor Danny Poole.



Sempar Accountancy and Tax Ltd

Sempar Accountancy and Tax Ltd considers its clients, team members and the community its people, and its vision is to inspire and grow them to achieve the extraordinary. Since business began five years ago, the company has grown from a start-up professional service firm of two employees to a team of 17. It fosters a supportive culture for its staff, and together they've grown the business from a modest start of £80,000 of reoccurring fees in 2016 to a turnover of £670,000 for the year ending 2021.



Stoke Chiro Spinal Health Centre

Stoke Chiro Spinal Health Centre offers chiropractic care and osteopathy to the community, as well as massage therapy. While its on-site wellness studio has been closed due to Covid, the team has continued to run yoga and pilates classes virtually and took to Zoom to continue its regular weekly coaching so that staff continue to develop techniques and skills. The Clav Club

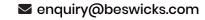

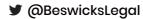
