## REDEVELOPMENT OF DÚN LAOGHAIRE BATHS

For many years now the beloved Edwardian Baths in Dun Laoghaire have been unused and derelict. After closing in the late 1980s it became a lost opportunity for people to come from the Town and to engage directly with the sea. After a succession of failed and at time controversial proposals the current proposal was brought forward in 2015.

From People's Park one now has a direct view through the park and across Queens Road to the Edwardian pavilion on the seafront. The pavilion houses a café and changing places bathroom at street level. Lift and stairs connect to the lower level, which features four artists' studios plus a common area for exhibitions and events.


Removing former dilapidated buildings onto the pavilion allows sunlight into the pavilion, and enables a new walkway between Newtownsmith's seafront promenade and Dún Laoghaire's East Pier, with various levels and staircases, a new jetty, sitting and viewing points, grassed areas and a refurbished Edwardian gazebo. Cast benches taking advantage of the sun's orientation are generously laid out for the enjoyment of all.

Construction is now well underway on this complex public project of additional accessible ramps between Queen's Road and the lowest sea level due for completion this summer.
