That's why we're often a bit vague. We say 'now now' or 'just now' when asked when we'll be there. We say "Ja Nee" when we agree - or maybe not.







SCENARIO 1: LEG DAY

SCENARIO 2: JUST A BABY

Scene: It's nighttime and we're in the living room of newly-wed couple. The husband has the limited edition Ask Oreo cookies placed on the side table, with a baby monitor close by, and some 'baby' items and toys scattered around.

A young couple lounges on the couch, mid-debate. The husband munches on an Oreo, as he pleads, *“She’s just a baby!”*. His wife, unimpressed and deadpans says a hard, *“No.”* He tries again, *“But you know she doesn’t sleep well unless she’s with us...”*, but the wife stays firm — *“It’s called sleep training”*. With a hopeful grin, he suggests, *“...let’s ask Oreo?”*
