Out-and-about





Getting to the SEC

Exhibition Way, Glasgow G3 8YW

The Scottish Event Campus is located just outside Glasgow city centre in the west-end of Glasgow. The campus is accessible by a number of transport options.

By road

The SEC (Scottish Event Campus) is conveniently situated for motorists, just off the M8 motorway. There is plenty of parking within the multi-storey carpark operated by City Parking LLP where payment can be made by cash or credit/debit card on arrival or before departure.

By rail

There are more than 20 direct trains per day from London and direct trains from Edinburgh run every 15 minutes on week days. The SEC has its own dedicated railway station – Exhibition Centre – allowing easy access from the city centre and suburbs. There are six trains an hour (around every 10 minutes) from Glasgow Central station, departing from Platform 17 (low level).

By air

Glasgow's international airport is a 15 minute drive from the SEC, and provides direct access to and from major European and North American cities. Glasgow Prestwick Airport is a 45 minute drive by direct motorway link from the SEC.
